This includes the 1,100+ people who have taken the pledge and signed up to adopt a street or public space through our Massachusetts Litter Cleanup Crew program.

Without the collective actions of Massachusetts residents, businesses, and employees, none of what we have achieved would be possible. A special shoutout goes to the leaders of our 36 local Keep Massachusetts Beautiful chapters for all they do to improve their communities.

I also appreciate the financial support we have received from the Massachusetts business community and our individual donors.

One of the highlights of our year was the return of an in-person celebration for our annual Clean Community Awards, hosted by WCVB Chief Meteorologist Cindy Fitzgibbon. Thank you to everyone who turned out for a fun and joyous celebration on October 20, 2022, at the Lyman Estate in Waltham, as well as our event sponsors. We're planning to host a celebration for our 2023 honorees on March 21, 2024.

Looking ahead to the remainder of 2023 and beyond, I am focused on growing the number of KMB chapters, while continuing to support our existing network. And I will be redoubling efforts to find a source of sustainable funding from within the state budget.

The collective value of the thousands of volunteers who are cleaning up and removing tons of litter from the Massachusetts landscape would cost local and state government agencies hundreds of thousands—if not millions of dollars—if paid employees performed this important work. 
OUR PROGRAMS & IMPACT

Litter Cleanup

We offer a variety of ways for individuals and groups to participate in litter cleanup activities, including:

The Great Massachusetts Cleanup

Every year, volunteers in communities across the state organize community-wide litter cleanups as part of the Great Massachusetts Cleanup. The majority of these cleanups occur during the months of April and May, as well as during the summer and fall months.







*Results are estimates based on partial reporting from KMB chapter network for the period between July 1, 2022, and June 30, 2023.

Please note that these results represent a partial share of KMB's impact. Our chapters are more focused on taking action to clean up litter, rather than reporting their results. The results of many cleanups are not shared with us, so the actual impact of KMB's network is much greater than reported here.

The Massachusetts Litter Cleanup Crew

This program encourages individual volunteers to incorporate litter cleanups into their regular daily, weekly, or monthly routines. Volunteers pledge to keep a particular street, park or neighborhood litter-free, and in exchange, KMB ships them an official Massachusetts litter cleanup crew kit. Each litter cleanup crew kit includes a litter grabber tool, gloves, reusable bag, a volunteer tee shirt, and a reusable litter bag for use inside vehicles. As of June 30, 2023, we have shipped 1,096 kits.

Corporate Community Service Cleanups

Our Corporate Community Service program matches up businesses in search of a worthy community service project with public spaces that are in need of litter cleanup. KMB works closely with company staff to organize a rewarding community service event for employees. This includes finding a suitable site, providing all cleanup supplies, coordinating with local municipal or state partners to ensure the collected trash is removed, and handling public relations and social media efforts. Beautification & Community Greening



Our local chapters manage local beautification and community greening programs, including downtown flower barrel programs, adopt-a-spot programs, mural painting projects, and other programs. KMB provides direct financial support to promote the planting of public pollinator gardens through our Plant Something Bee-eautiful program. This year, we are grateful for Noble Oak Whiskey's \$10,000 grant to support this program!

Plant Something Bee-eautiful

Each year, our annual Plant Something Bee-eautiful program awards grants to Keep Massachusetts Beautiful chapters and other organizations to support the planting of pollinator-friendly gardens and trees in public spaces. The goal is not only to beautify public spaces, but also to restore habitats for pollinators.



For the 2023 grant cycle, we awarded \$10,000 in grants to support the following projects:

- Keep Plainville Beautiful: \$2,500 for the creation of a new pollinator garden at Telford Park.
- Keep Mansfield Beautiful: \$2,500 for the restoration of the pollinator garden at the Jordan Jackson School.
- Keep Framingham Beautiful: \$1,500 for the installation of a new pollinator garden at Farm Pond, a popular public park.
- Keep Walpole Beautiful: \$500 for the installation of new adopt-a-spot locations and pollinator habitats.
- **Cove Elementary School in Beverly:** \$500 for the creation of a new pollinator garden in collaboration with a team of fourth-grade students and parents.
- Wakullah Street Community Garden in Roxbury: \$500 for the creation of a dedicated pollinator garden for bees, butterflies, and other creatures.
- Aptucxet Garden Club of Bourne: \$500 for the creation of a new pollinator garden and educational signage at the Jonathan Bourne Public Library.
- Nahant Community Garden: \$500 for an upgraded pollinator garden and raised beds at the Johnson School, a cooperative community resource.
- **Grow Native in Waltham:** \$500 for the restoration of a pollinator garden in partnership with Waltham Fields Community Farm.
- South Shore YMCA Family Farm in Hanover: \$500 for the creation of a new pollinator garden along the walking path from Camp Gordon Clark.

Environmental Education

We're proud of the thousands of volunteers across Massachusetts who are taking action to clean up our environment. However, we also believe that a more effective long-term solution to these challenges is to educate the public about how to change and improve their behaviors. This includes teaching people of all ages not to litter, as well as how to reduce their consumption of single-use products and how to recycle correctly.

Talking Trash & Recycling



The Talking Trash & Recycling program is an interactive presentation that teaches residents, employees, and students about what happens to their trash and recyclables here in Massachusetts. Attendees learn ways to reduce the amount of trash they generate, how to improve their recycling habits, and how to make small changes to lead a more sustainable lifestyle, while also helping the Commonwealth of Massachusetts achieve its solid waste reduction goals. This interactive program is delivered in 45 minutes with 15-30 additional minutes for questions and answers at the end. Next-Gen Environmental Leader Scholarship

In 2022, KMB launched a new annual \$2,500 Next-Gen Environmental Leader Scholarship. This scholarship supports a high school senior student who will be pursuing a degree in environmental studies or a related field at an accredited institution of higher learning.

The purpose of this scholarship is to support students who have demonstrated a commitment to environmental protection and environmental justice.

Lauren Morley, 18, of Mansfield High School was the 2023 recipient of our scholarship.

Lauren is majoring in biomedical engineering at Worcester Polytechnic Institute and is also considering a minor in environmental sciences.

Earlier in 2023, Lauren earned the Girl Scout Gold Award in recognition of her efforts to pass a Mansfield bylaw in 2020—euphemistically known in Mansfield as "Lauren's Straw Law." This bylaw made plastic straws and stirrers available by request only, rather than being automatically handed out to local customers. Since then, other organizations—including Walt

Disney World-have adopted a similar approach.

Lauren earned the rank of Eagle Scout in 2022—the first female Eagle Scout in Mansfield's history. For her Eagle Scout project, she created a 2,000-square-foot native plant pollinator garden at the entrance to the Mansfield Great Woods Trails. She raised more than \$1,000 to support her yearlong project and organized multiple work days to groom and prepare the soil, spread loam, and plant native plants, shrubs, and grasses.

"I appreciate Keep Massachusetts Beautiful's financial support for my education," says Lauren. "As an aspiring biomedical engineer, I

believe it will be important for people from my generation to solve problems using cleaner energy, greener fuels, and sustainable materials. I am excited to study how medical advancements at the cellular and genetic level may also extend to improvements in our food and water sources, as well as waste management in our communities."
